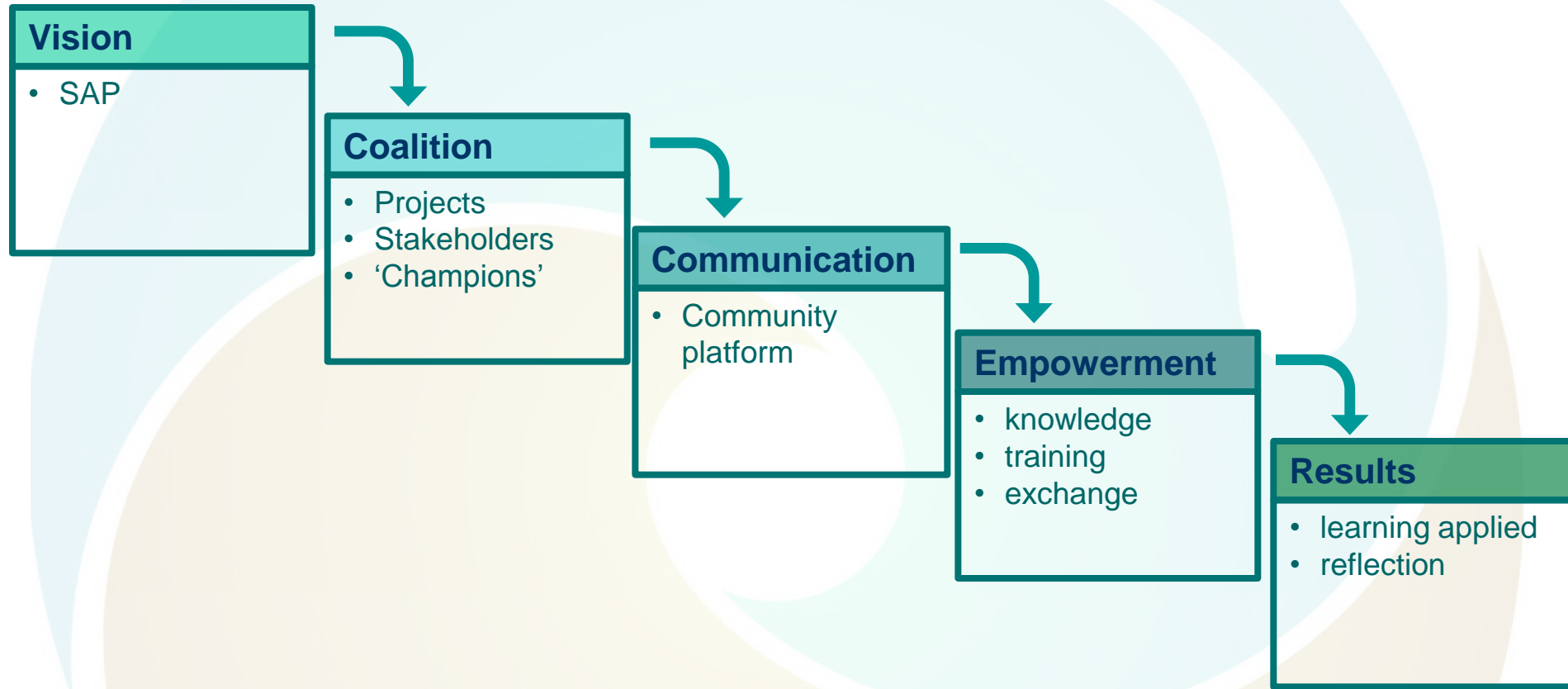

The present report represents an attempt to analyse the GEF IW portfolio of groundwater projects with a view to guide the identification of lessons learnt and replicable practices, and to promote a structured exchange of experiences among projects through the establishment and functioning of a facilitated Community of Practice. It is intended that other non – groundwater projects that might benefit from being exposed to groundwater issues will also be involved in the Community in order to achieve an overall advancement in the application of IWRM principles and of conjunctive surface and groundwater management.

This document is a draft version prepared for the 6th GEF Biennial International Waters Conference (IWC), taking place in Dubrovnik on 17-20 October 2011. The GEF Groundwater Portfolio Analysis, edited by Andrea Merla, Senior Consultant at UNESCO-IHP, is the first contribution to the Global Groundwater Community of Practice, in the framework of the IW:LEARN 3 Project "Strengthening IW Portfolio Delivery and Impact".

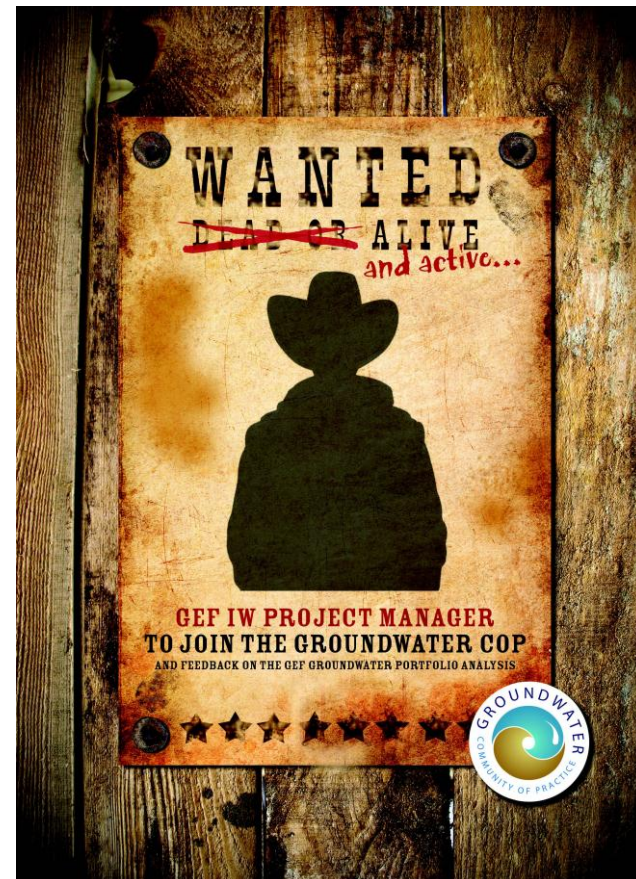

- target outputs and outcomes



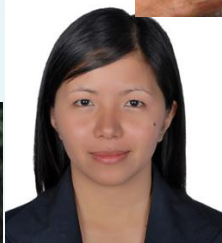
Role of moderators
