FROM THE EDITOR:

The month of October kicked off with the organization of a Workshop on Final Meeting of the Regional Transboundary Diagnostic Analysis (TDA) Working Group at the Regional Coordination Unit held from 3 - 7 October, 2005. The Opening Ceremony of the Workshop was graced by the presence of the Minister of Harbour and Railways, Prof. Christopher Ameyaw-Akumfi who made a heart warming speech of support. Prof. Alfred Oteng-Yeboah, Deputy Director-General, Council for Scientific and Industrial Research chaired the occasion.

The main objectives of this Workshop were for the participants to review and further update the TDA documents, review and finalize the set of developed Indicators (process, stress reduction and environmental status), finally review the Log Frame Matrix and to fill any identified Gaps in the TDA document.

Following the TDA/SAP Workshop was a Workshop on Validation of Results from the GCLME/FAO/IMR Joint Assessment Survey which was organized at the Regional Coordination Unit, Accra from 10 - 14 October. The Deputy Minister of Fisheries, Ghana, Mr. Daniel Dugan honoured both the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Workshop with his presence. During the 5 - day Workshop, the participants analyzed the data collected by the FishTrawl Cruise (4 - 19 July 2005) and processed by the Plankton and Benthos Working Group (12 - 16 September, 2005).

Between 9 - 12 October, the Environment Officer, Dr. Jacques Abe was on a mission to Dakar, Senegal on behalf of the Regional Director to participate in Final Meeting of the Regional TDA/SAP Working Group: Accra, 03 - 07 October, 2005.

the 1st Meeting of the Canary Current LME project from 10 - 12 October, 2005. The Meeting was held in Saly, 85 KM from Dakar. GCLME project was invited to assist the CCLME in writing its TDA document by sharing with them its experiences in the process of producing the GCLMETDA document.

The Environment Officer, Dr. Jacques Abe continued his mission to Guinea Bissau between 16 - 23 October to represent the Regional Director in participation of the launching of the GCLME project.
