Plan for Results-Based Monitoring and Evaluation of the UNDP-Implemented IW:LEARN Operational Phase Project

June 3, 2007

Background

Among recommendations of the January 2007 the independent <u>Mid-Term Evaluation</u> [MTE] for IW:LEARN Operational Phase were a call for:

- Steering Committee [SC] to agree to a single line of management authority across UNDP- and UNEP-implemented IW:LEARN projects. (Recommendation #16)
- PCU to provide M&E plan for SC review and signoff at June 2007 SC meeting. (Rec. #13)
- [UNDP (and UNEP?)] to present TOR for IW:LEARN's Terminal Evaluator [TE] to SC in 2007Q4, for hiring by December 31, 2007. (Rec. #10)

Since then, IW:LEARN's SC has accepted UNEP proposal for a loosely configured Coordinating Agreement between UNOPS (as UNDP's executing agency) and UNEP, in lieu of MTE call for a single line of management authority. As a result, UNDP and UNOPS Project Coordinating Unit (PCU) have proposed that these managerially distinct projects pursue independent M&E paths from now through their separately scheduled TEs in early 2008 (UNDP) and early 2009¹ (UNEP).

As a result, this M&E plan focuses only on the UNOPS-executed IW:LEARN project.

UNOPS PCU Approach

- Continue to track, monitor and report on progress transforming INPUTS to OUTPUTS through Component B-E activities (quarterly)
- Document IW:LEARN-fostered learning, its application, & future learning needs on an event-by-event basis, including knowledge and needs baseline (pre-tests) wherever feasible
- Monitor &, through TE, evaluate IW:LEARN results (Outcomes & IMPACTS)
- Collect data to establish baseline of projects' needs for and ability to contribute to any future IW:LEARN project.

¹ UNEP-IW:LEARN Terminal Evaluation is scheduled for several months after UNOPS IW:LEARN PCU is scheduled to close; hence delay of UNDP TE until that time would likely affect PCU continuity and its staff's availability.

- UNOPS **PCU** provides SC with annual update on APPR/PIR-related indicators for Operational Phase (coverage, outcomes and catalytic impacts, progress and outputs, disbursement and co-finance).

- UNDP **EO** invites and obtains **SC** and **PCU** feedback on draft TE TORs for UNDP-implemented IW:LEARN.

- **PCU** works with UNEP-IW:LEARN to set up www.iwlearn.net/te as transparent, public Web space for Terminal Evaluator to interact with IW:LEARN stakeholders.

Definitions

Catalytic Impact (Indicator) – spin-off catalytic results: results from GEF IW learning activities; new conventions, treaties, protocols, legal reforms; catalysis in IAs: internalized or by new partnerships; with IAs & multilateral & bilateral organizations.

Evaluation – Independent assessment of progress towards achieving outputs and success in realizing expected results (impacts). Independently conducted and reported to GEF mid-term through big projects (MTE) and at end of all projects (Terminal Evaluation).

Indicators – quantitative or qualitative measures of level of attainment towards objectives in meaningful and practical way.

Inputs – see chart⁴ below.

Monitoring – collection of indicator information before (baseline), during (progress) and through after (results) project intervention/implementation. Self-reported annually by project management to GEF.

Monitoring and Evaluation Plan – strategic plan for collecting and "digesting" data to derive and measure change in M&E indicators – or even PM&E indicators throughout the project (and beyond).
