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Basic Facts

- Healthy Ecosystem : A resource for Healthy Economies
- Role is diminished by a plethora of stressors
- Necessity to enhance ability to develop and implement effective remedial programmes for improving quality of degraded habitats
- From an ecological perspective, the critical processes controlling the structure and function of biological communities can best be addressed on a regional basis LME Approach





Data Needs

Include a range of activities needed to provide management information about ecosystem conditions, tracking perturbations and resources at risk

Before GCLME Project: data spatially and temporally fragmented, lack of comparability and inaccessibility.

Currently Data obtained from time series assessments based on 5 Modules.





Methodologies

- 1. Standardization basis for intercomparability
- 2. Achieved along 5 Module Approach 1st Year
- 3. Coastal Monitoring Contracts 16 countries


